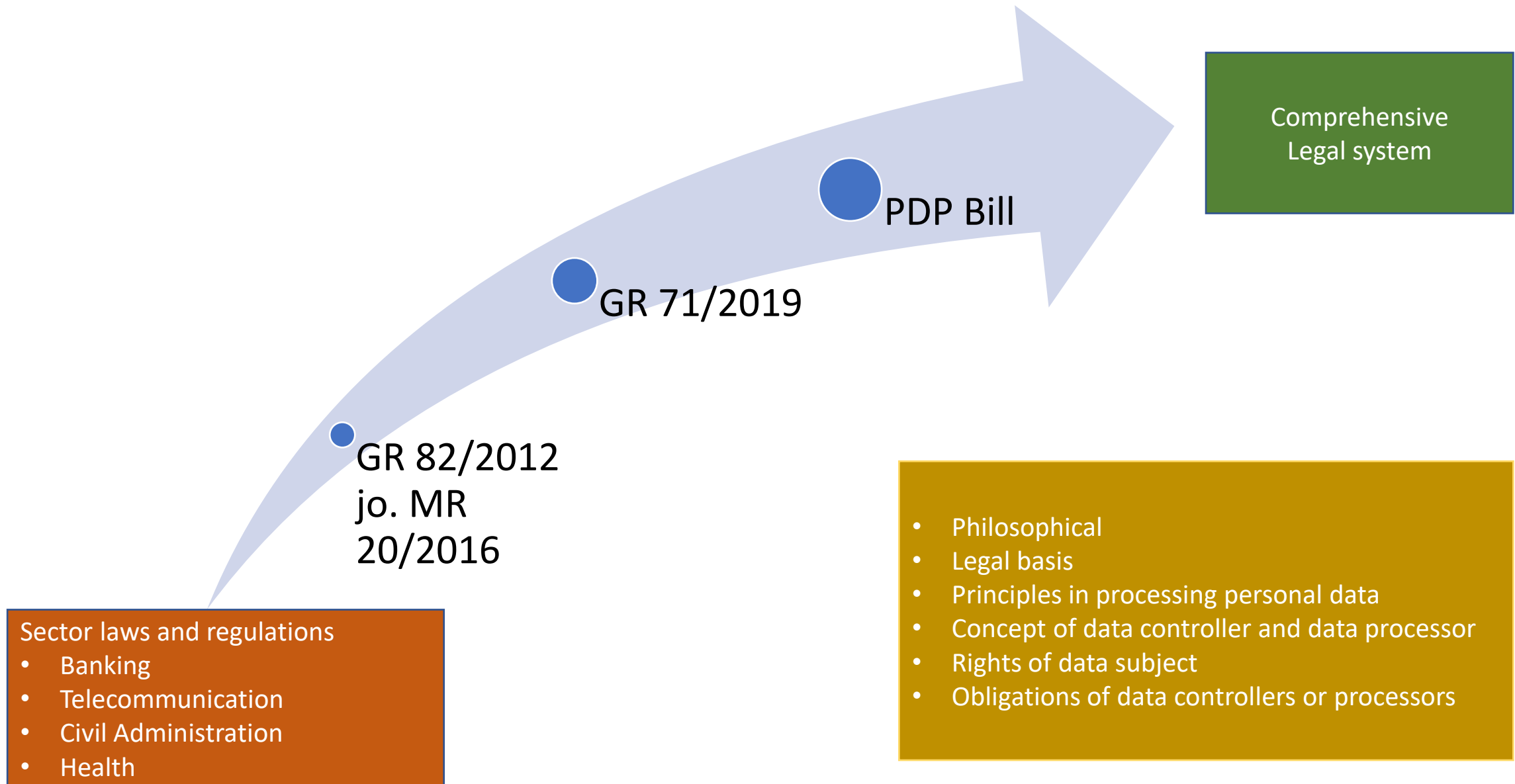
- Government role and responsibilities under EITA

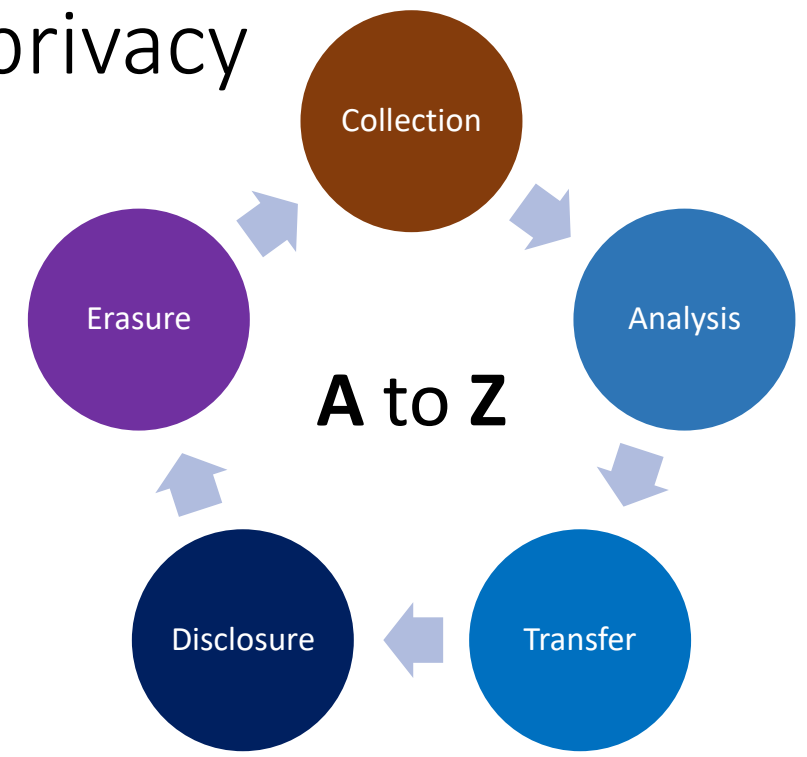


Government's policy to protect data privacy

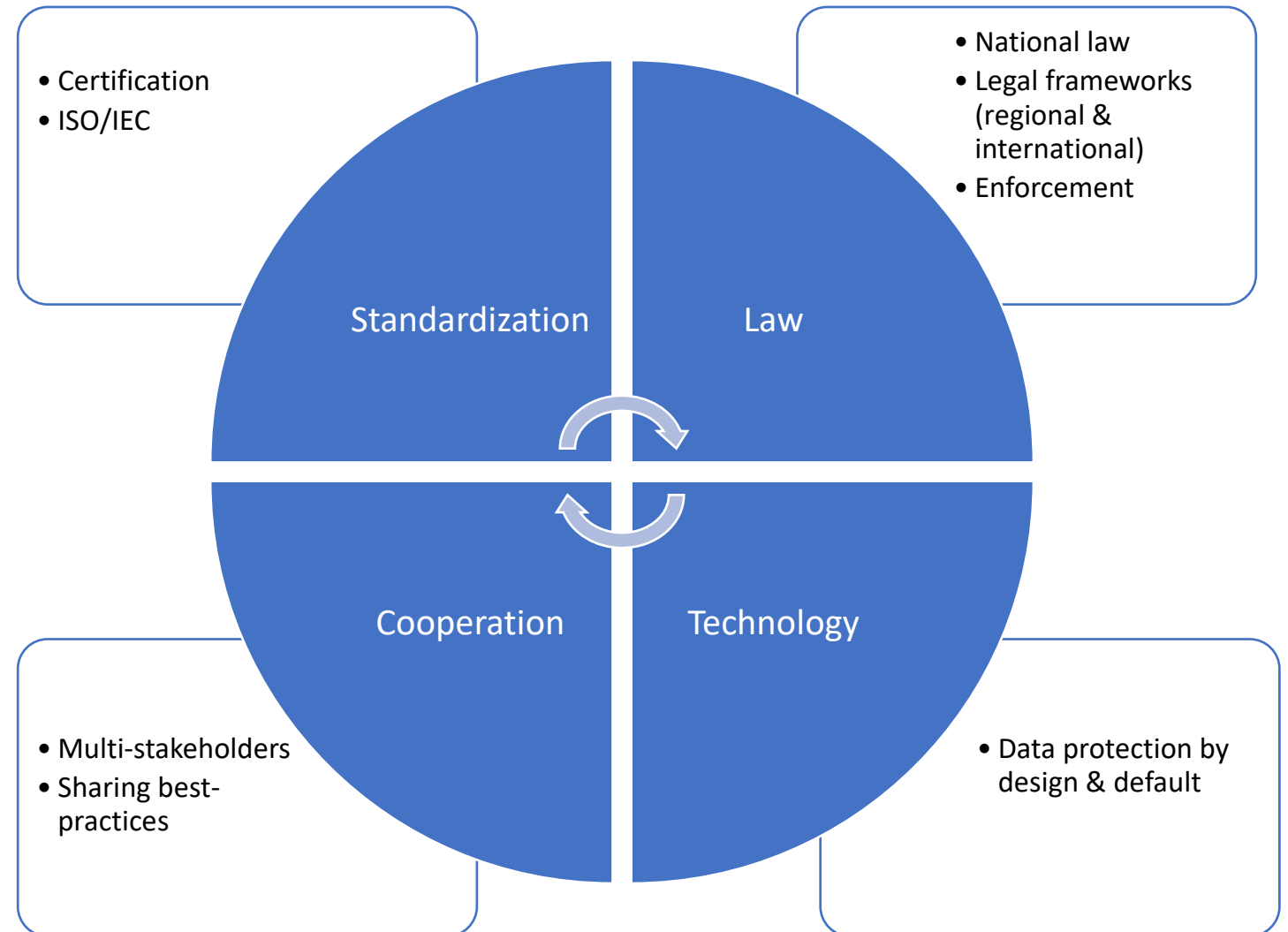
